Re: California Proposition 65

To: Whom it may concern

Thank you for the inquiry about the compliance of Poly products to the California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (California Proposition 65), as well as the amendments to Article 6 regarding clear and reasonable warnings and labeling requirements, effective August 2018. The law requires businesses to inform consumers about exposure to certain chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm.

Exposure is determined by the amount of a chemical present in a product and the possibility of a user's exposure to that chemical through normal usage of the product.

No Poly products require a Proposition 65 warning label due to any user exposure to a Proposition 65 chemical above the safe harbor level.

Poly monitors additions to the Prop 65 chemical list maintained by California OEHHA for additions that may impact Poly products. Appropriate labeling will be applied to any appropriate products as necessary.
